In response to your views and suggestions we have or will be:

Extracurricular activities

Due to safety measures in place, we were unable to offer after school clubs for most of the year. When clubs did restart, we were limited to what we could offer. This year, with restrictions lifting slightly, staff have stepped up to the mark. For this term, we have:

Monday – Football (Yrs 5 & 6), Dance (Yrs 1 & 2)

Tuesday – Guitar (KS2), Multi-Skills (Yrs 1 & 2), Reading Café (KS2) and German (Yrs 4, 5 & 6)

Wednesday – Netball (Yrs 5 & 6) and Cooking (Yr 4)

Thursday – Art (KS1), Art (KS2) and Cross Country

Parent Consultations

Due to restrictions last year, parents were unable to come into school for face-to-face meetings. We therefore moved to telephone consultations. The feed back on this was extremely positive, however it did not provide parents with the opportunity to look at their children's books in school. This year we will continue with parent consultations being held via a telephone consultation in the Autumn Term but there will be an opportunity for parents to come into school for a book look on Monday, 15th November. We will hopefully move the spring parental consultation to face to face.

Regarding the spring term parent consultations, we hope to return to face-to-face meetings.

Current Year 1 parents not having the opportunity to come into school.

Due to restrictions, last years' Reception parents were unable to come into school. Therefore, this year we held the Year 1 parents meeting in the hall followed by a walk to the Year 1 classroom and a peep inside the Reception class. In order to keep all safe, we kept numbers to a minimum by allowing only one parent per child and parents were asked to wear masks and areas were cleaned afterwards.

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Smarter Uniform

Over the course of the year, there was a noticeable decline in the standard of uniform especially regarding PE kits. The uniform policy was distributed in the summer term and reminders given in the newsletter. We have seen an improvement as the children returned in September.

We ask parents to ensure children come to school wearing the appropriate school uniform. Children should not be wearing nail varnish and only a watch and studs for those with their ears pierced.


We will be contacting parents when children do not come into school in the correct PE kit. Our kit consists of black shorts and a white t-shirt (with school logo on) which is available to purchase from the school office. Children can wear a tracksuit dark in colour (black, navy, grey). Branded clothing is not part of our PE uniform, and we ask that you do not send your child to school in branded items or pink/sparkly tops/leggings.
